Fall Application & Enrollment Checklist

This checklist is only a guide and does not include every contingency that a student may face when applying to UM-Ann Arbor. Students applying to UM-Ann Arbor should follow instructions and guidelines from the Admissions website (**admissions.umich.edu**) and the college or school they wish to major in.

The fall, spring, and summer term admissions deadline for most programs is **Feb. 1**. All application materials must be received by Admissions for consideration by this date.

Examine If Michigan Is Right for You – Right Now

The University of Michigan is a highly ranked national university. We are ranked consistently as one of the best public universities nationally by U.S. News and World Report and one of the best public universities in the world by QS World University Rankings.

We lead the world in areas of business, engineering, research, medicine, mental health care, and many other fields. Admission to the university is a competitive process, and our students, once here, need to be very well prepared academically to succeed.

We suggest that if you have been out of high school for more than two years, consider taking some college-level courses prior to applying. Preferably those classes would be taught in a classroom at a community college, public university, or regionally accredited school.

Some military training such as the Defense Language Institute and military academies would be acceptable as well. Most of our students who have served in the military or who are now serving took college-level classes before they applied to U-M.

Prepare Your Application

- 1. Collect your official high school records or GED information.
- 2. Request all post-secondary institutional transcripts including all coursework outside of high school or accredited military colleges.
- 3. Request transcripts from all military training and colleges:
 - Joint Services Transcript: jst.doded.mil/jst
 - □ Air University (formally Community College of the Air Force): auservicedesk.af.edu/education?id=au_landing

→ U-M is very conservative in awarding credits for classes or programs that were taken at other institutions. It is the discretion of the school or college within the university to what credits will transfer. Learn more at <u>admissions.umich.edu/apply/transfer-applicants/</u><u>transfer-credit</u>.

5) Send or Self-report Your Test Scores

Submitting ACT or SAT scores is optional. If you took either test as a high school student, you can send those scores to the university so they can be evaluated as part of your transfer application; please have the scores sent directly to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions from the testing agency. If you have not yet had your scores reported to the University of Michigan, you may request to have them sent online using these links:

SAT (U-M code is 1839): sat.collegeboard.org/scores

Please Note: Rush paper scores are not accepted.

Remember:

If you did not take the ACT or SAT as a high school student, you should NOT sit for the exams as a college student. Standardized test scores are not required for your application.

6)

Submit Application

All transfer students are required to submit the following prior to the deadline date.

If you are applying to the College of Literature, Science, and the Arts (LSA) or Engineering, you will use the Common App (**commonapp.org**).

The application fee is waived for current and former military members for the Common App.

Application Checklist:

- □ U-M Essay Questions and Writing Supplement: admissions.umich.edu/apply/transfer-applicants/essayquestions
- □ Final official secondary school record, including 9th-12th grades, test data, and graduation date
- □ GED results (if applicable)
- □ Official transcripts from all post-secondary institutions
- □ Academic evaluator/instructor recommendation (recommended but not required); if this is not available, a letter from a commanding officer or NCO
- □ Application fee (if applicable)
- □ Required test scores (MET, TOEFL, IELTS, Duolingo), if applicable, for non-native speakers of English

However, many offer cross-campus transfer so you can apply for winter semester through our College of Literature, Science, and the Arts, and apply for transfer later to one of the schools below.

7) Apply for Financial Aid by March 31 (Or Sooner)

Even if you are using your VA benefits to pay for your education, we highly encourage you to apply for and fill out all financial aid paperwork. Federal aid is not connected with your VA benefits and can be used for other college expenses beyond tuition.

University of Michigan offers the Go Blue Guarantee. If your family income is below \$75K and you have less than \$75K in assets, you may qualify for up to four years of free tuition at Michigan's Ann Arbor campus, allowing you to save your veteran's benefits for graduate school or a family member. Admissions Decision

You will receive your admissions decision through Enrollment Connect (enrollmentconnect.umich.edu/account/login).

If you are not admitted, please call the Admissions office or your targeted school or college to find out how to improve your admissions candidacy – many students who are currently at the university applied more than once.

Many students who were initially not accepted need more college experience at a community college or other institution or need to improve their GPA. Please also contact us so we can talk to you about this.

9)

Pay Your Enrollment Deposit by May 1

To secure your place at the University of Michigan, you must pay your \$300 enrollment deposit via Enrollment Connect. Go to **teamdynamix.umich.edu/TDClient/154/Portal/KB/ArticleDet?ID=7464** for detailed instructions on how to pay.

If you cannot pay your enrollment deposit, you may apply for a waiver on Enrollment Connect. However, your deposit will be due when tuition is due.

Remember:

Your enrollment deposit is part of your tuition and will be refunded to you if you are using your Post 9/11 GI Bill.

10) Get Your Uniqname and U-M Email Address


Once you have paid your enrollment deposit, you will receive an email with instructions on how to set up your uniqname and your umich.edu email address. You should immediately start to regularly check that email address for all your campus messages.

11) Look at Your Housing Options

You will get instructions on how to access your University Housing application when your enrollment deposit has been paid or waived.

14) Apply for VA Educational Benefits
